Outstanding Achievement Award in Honor of Fred M. Coombs

- This award focuses on significant achievements that served to advance public recreation and parks and produced substantial enduring positive impacts on the quality of life in Pennsylvania through recreation and parks, including:
 - Candidate's work experience
 - Awards and special recognitions
 - Elected or appointed offices held
 - Committee work
 - Speeches, writing, research, and professional development
 - Community involvement
 - Demonstration of POWER principles
- Requirements:
 - Current or retired PRPS professional member
 - Minimum of 10 years compensated experience

PRPS Distinguished Member Award in Honor of Robert D. Griffith

- Service to PRPS (most important)
- Candidate's work experience
- Service to related associations or groups
- Improvements to a recreation and parks or related curriculum at the undergraduate or graduate level
- Volunteer efforts within recreation and parks
- Initiation of new recreation programs
- Development of new methods of parks operation or maintenance
- Contributions to the expansion of the recreation and parks profession
- Advocacy or legislative contributions
- Enthusiasm for the profession
- Demonstration of POWER principles
- Requirements:
 - Current PRPS professional membership
 - Minimum of 10 years compensated experience



PRPS Recognition and Awards Program AWARD CRITERIA

Outstanding New Professional Award

- Candidate's work experience
- Contributions to the advancement of PRPS, affiliated organizations, or the recreation and parks profession in general
- Service to the candidate's employing agency
- Service to PRPS
- Volunteer community service
- Demonstration of POWER principles
- Requirements:
 - Less than 11 years of full-time, compensated experience in the recreation and parks profession
 - Current PRPS professional membership

Community Champion Award (available to individuals or groups)

- Contributions to recreation and parks having a stimulating local, state, regional, or national effect
- Continuing interest in recreation, parks, and leisure
- Leadership in the conduct of some project or area of service related to recreation and parks
- Volunteer contributions in support of recreation and parks
- Donation of funding, materials, or human resources toward building or renovating a facility or program
- Ongoing major commitment of resources to the enhancement or maintenance of a facility or program

Excellence in Recreation and Parks

- Demonstration of the POWER principles
- Requirements:
 - Current PRPS membership (of sponsoring agency or person from agency submitting the award)
 - The entry must have been offered or produced during the current PRPS membership year
 - The entry may not be a recipient of a previous PRPS award unless there have been substantial changes to content or format
